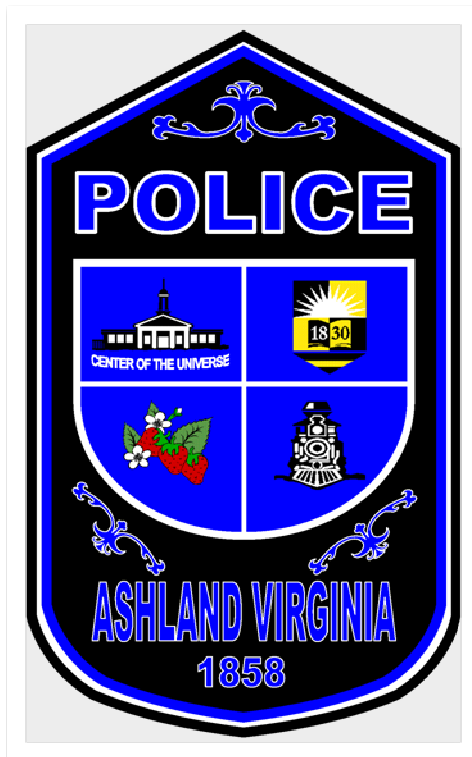


# Ashland Police Department



May 2011

Monthly Report

## INTRODUCTION

The monthly report is intended to serve as an overview of the Ashland Police Department's effort to combat crime within the Town of Ashland. The report contains information about the number of criminal offenses during the month of May 2011 and the activities undertaken by the Police Department to improve the overall quality of life for the community.

The information helps the Police Department develop strategies for providing a safe environment in which to live, work, visit and play. The information is also intended to keep the public and officials informed.

For the month of May our officers made a total of 35 criminal arrests. The department handled 53 Group-A offenses, of which 19 thus far have been cleared which gives our department a monthly clearance rate of 35.8%. Our overall clearance rate for all crimes is 61.7%.

## **Activity Highlights**

### **Day Shift (12 Hour)**

- Responded to **376** calls for service.
- Made **18** criminal arrests with **24** criminal charges.
- Completed **164** park, walk and talk activities.
- Completed **42** police reports.
- Issued **127** summons and **16** parking tickets.
- Completed **8** adopt-a-senior visits.
- Completed **17** lunch buddy visits.

### **Midnight Shift (12 Hour)**

- Responded to **361** calls for service.
- Made **17** criminal arrests with **22** criminal charges.
- Completed over **296** park, walk and talk activities.
- Completed **46** police reports.
- Issued **95** summons and **1** parking ticket.
- Completed **1751** property checks.
- Completed **7** adopt-a-senior visits.

### **Progress in the South Taylor, Arlington and Randolph Streets Corridor**

Officers handled **11** calls for service in this area, completed **59** park, walk and talk activities as well as **35** hours of traffic enforcement and observation and bike patrol time. Officers issued **2** summons, made **5** criminal arrests, made **125** community contacts, conducted **7** hours of bike patrol and conducted **3** roll calls.

### **Training**

- Sgt. Jenks conducted spike strip and pursuit policy training during the month of May.
- Sergeant Kemp, Corporal Gray, Officer Nuessle and Officer Miles attended Intoxilyzer recertification class.
- Officer Nuessle attended a Virginia Gang Investigators Association meeting during the month of May.
- Officers Stirnaman attended Basic Tracking Training.
- Sergeant Hicks successfully completed Firearm Instructor School.

### **Community Policing**

- There were eight senior visits conducted during this month.
- The community-policing officer attended the monthly T.R.I.A.D. meeting which was held at the Ashland Police Department.
- 87 businesses were visited during this period.
- 83 community contacts were made.
- Three and a half hours of foot patrol were conducted in the S.T.A.R. corridor.
- A security assessment was performed at Commonwealth Boat Brokers.
- A neighborhood watch meeting was held on South Taylor St. May 2, 2011
- Chief Goodman attended the South Taylor clean up day on May 21, 2011

### **Investigations:**

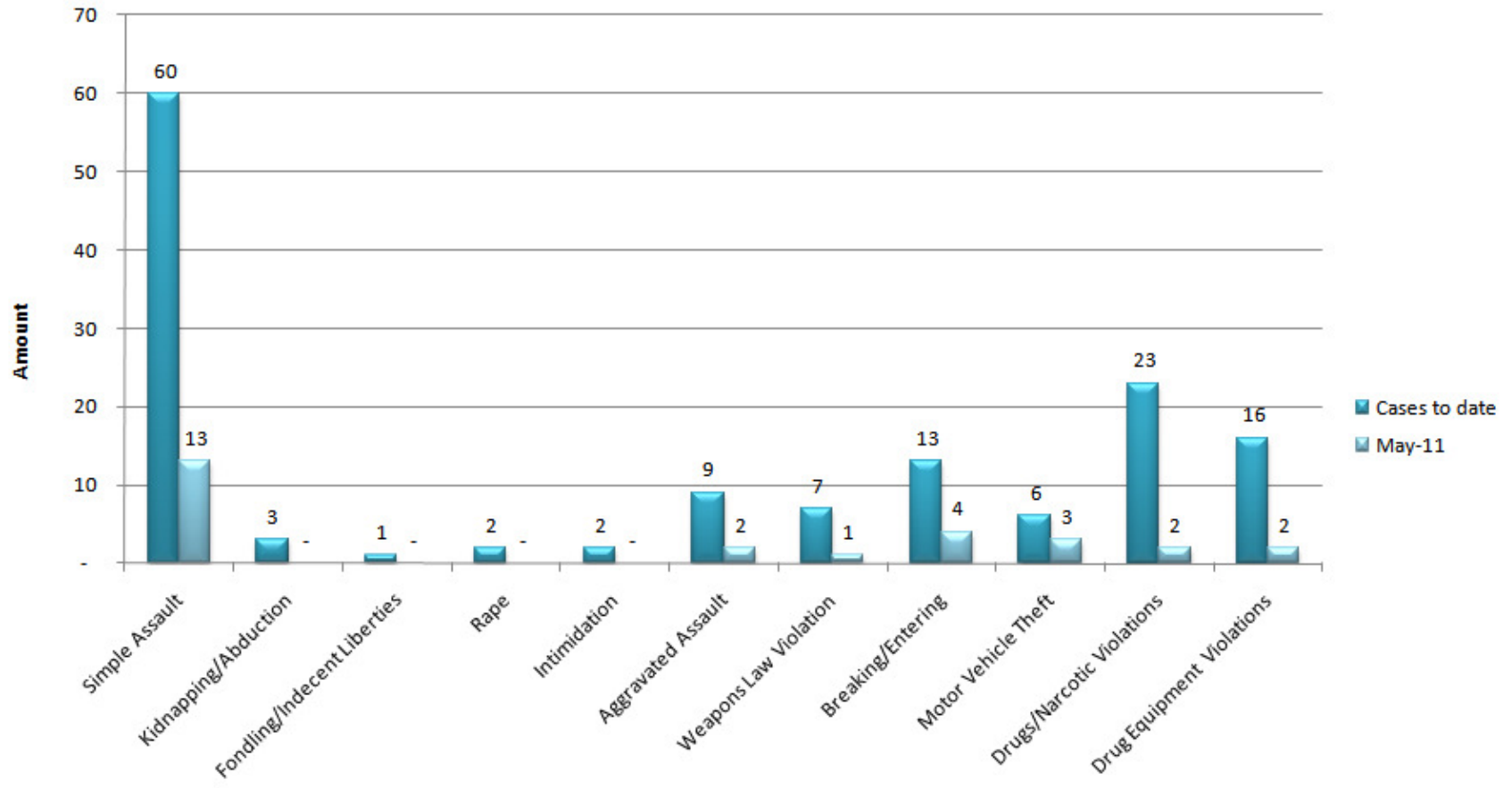
- Five cases were assigned, three are still under investigation, one incident has pending warrants, and one is inactive.

### **Highlights**

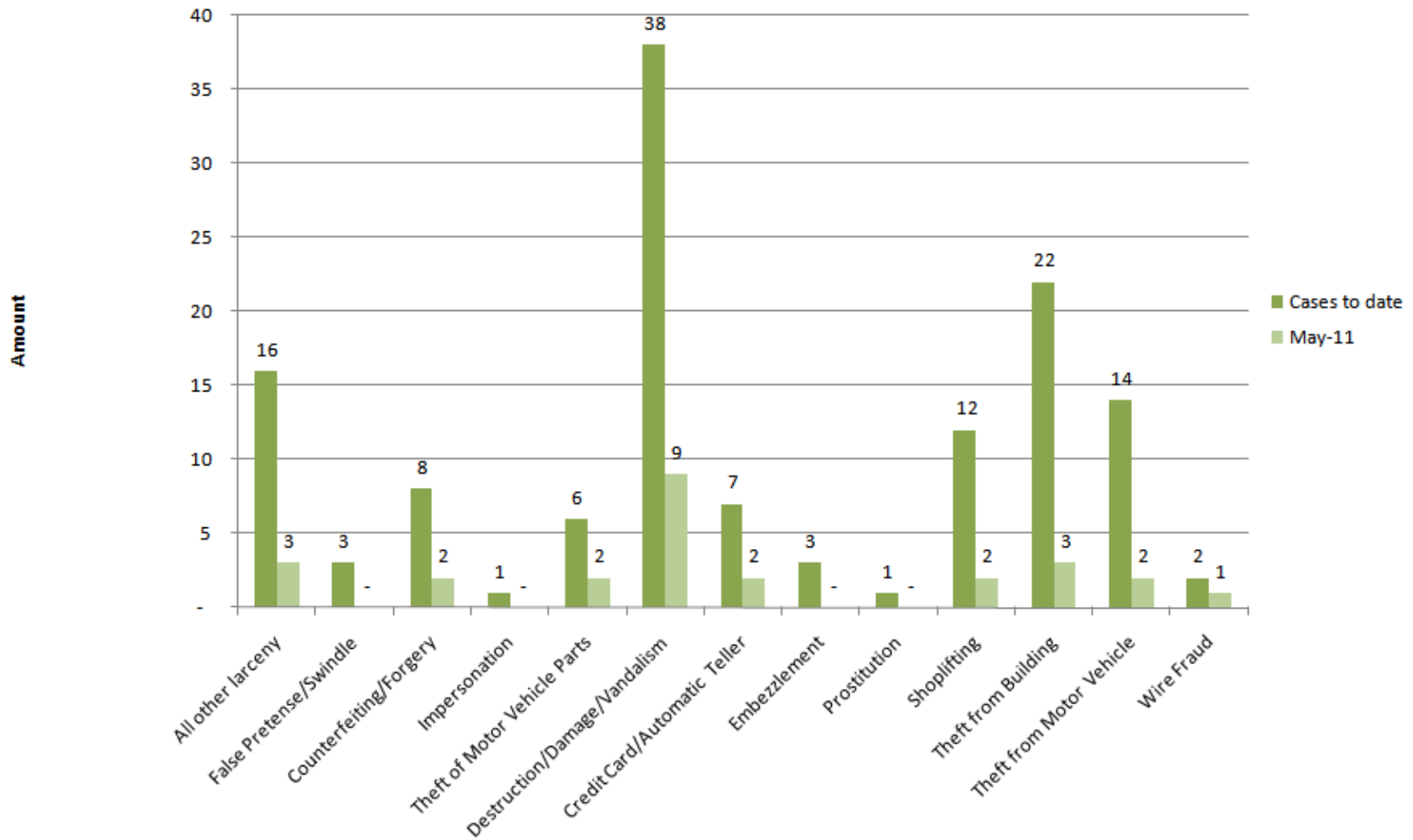
- May 1, 2011, officers investigated a vandalism that occurred the previous night at several businesses on Arbor oak Drive. Officer's investigation led to the arrest of a juvenile for these crimes. Juvenile were released to their parents.
- May 7, 2011, officers investigated a domestic assault on Arbor Oak Drive. As a result of this investigation a male subject was arrested for domestic assault and possession of marijuana. An emergency protective order was issued and served on both parties.
- May 12, 2011, officers conducted a traffic stop in which their investigation of a passenger led to his arrest for possession of marijuana.
- May 16, 2011, officers conducted a traffic stop in which the driver presented a false government identification card. The driver was arrested on several traffic charges and providing a false identification. He was detained by ICE due to his immigration status.
- May 17, 2011, officers received a call that a subject wanted on felony charges was hiding in a residence on England Street. Officers searched the residence, located and arrested the wanted individual.
- May 17, 2011, officers observed a suspicious male in the area of the Ashland Woods apartment complex playground. Officer's investigation into the situation led to the subject being arrested for public intoxication.
- May 30, 2011, officers responded to a fight call in the Ashland Woods apartment complex. As a result of officer's investigation, eight warrants were obtained and served for disorderly conduct and assault.
- Bike patrol was conducted throughout the month and bike officers also assisted with the Clunker Cruise on May 7, 2011.
- Officers also assisted with RMC Graduation.

Throughout the month of May Traffic Safety Officers have been investigating a serious motorcycle versus pick-up truck crash which occurred on May 6, 2011. Their investigation was very thorough and led to several summonses being obtained for various traffic and administrative violations.

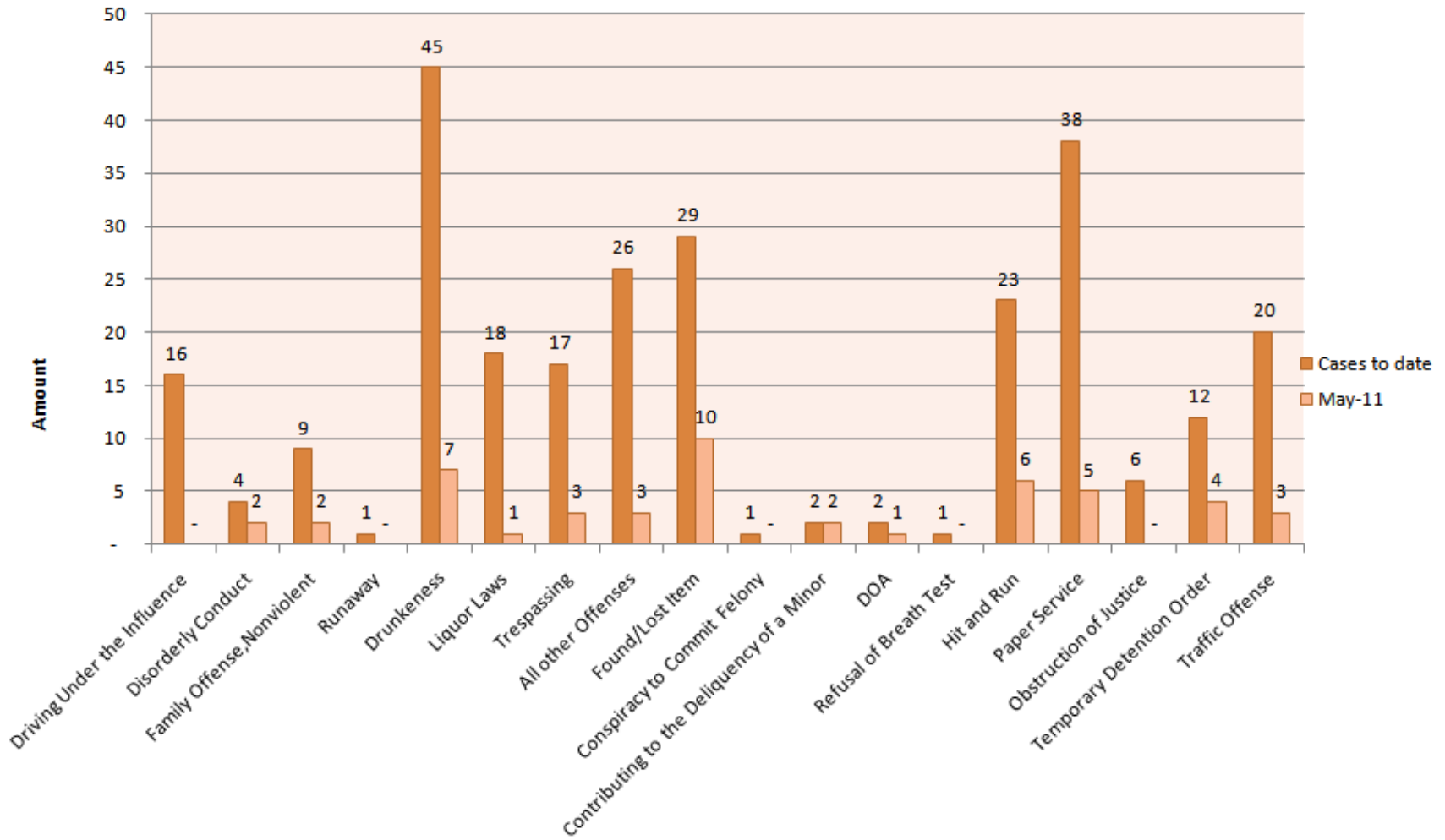
### Group A Offenses - Violent



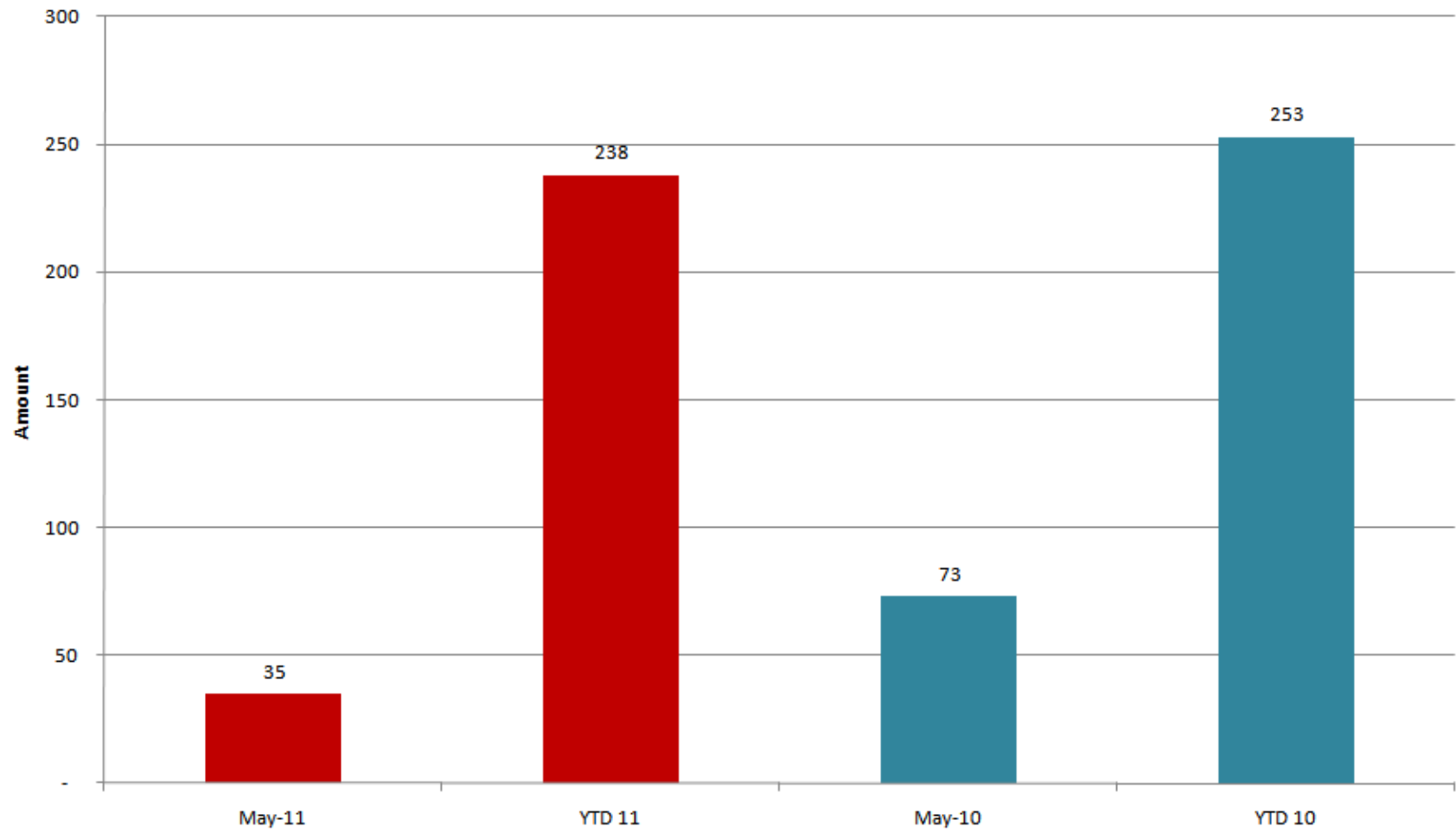
## Group A Offenses - Non-Violent



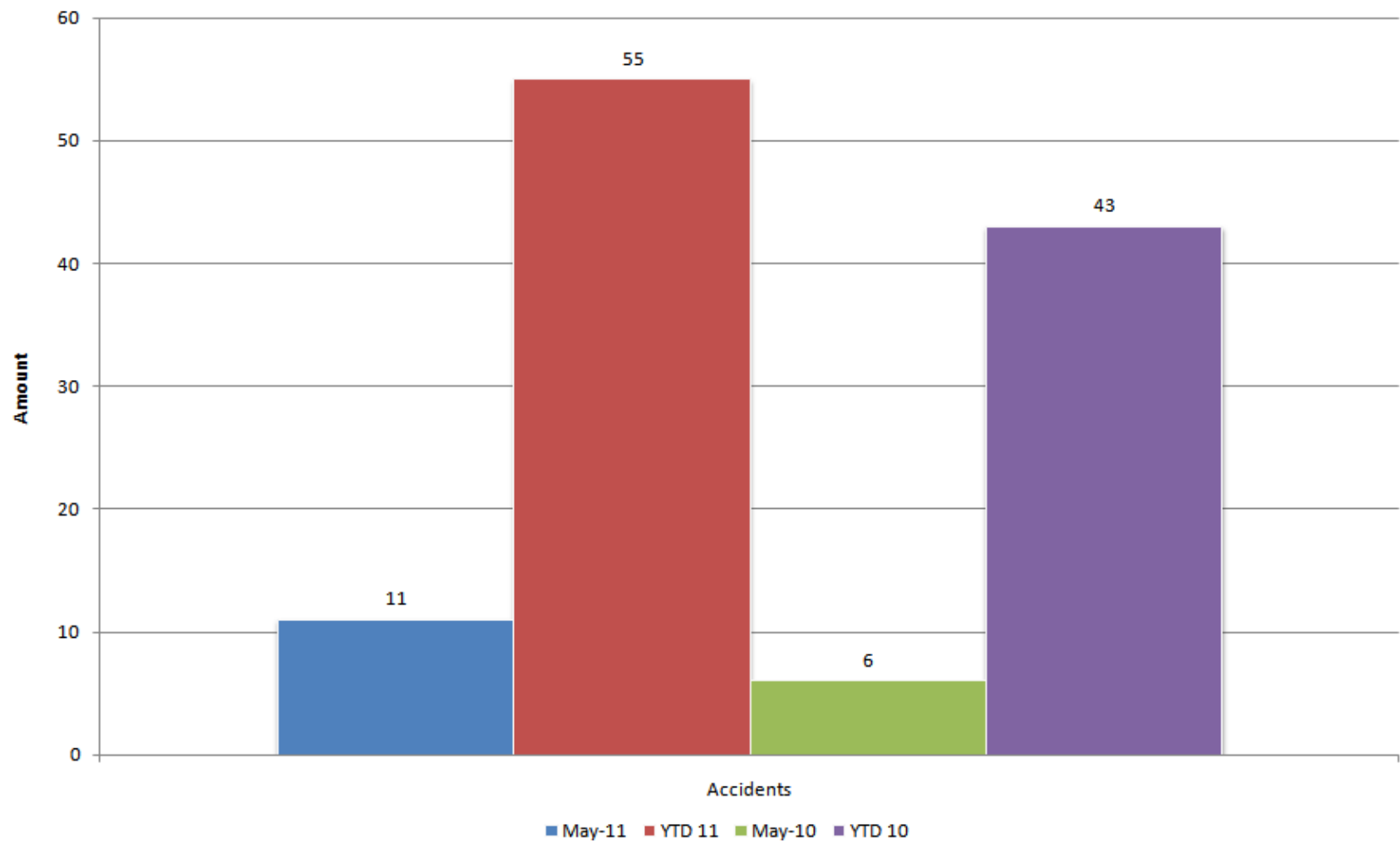
## Group B Offenses



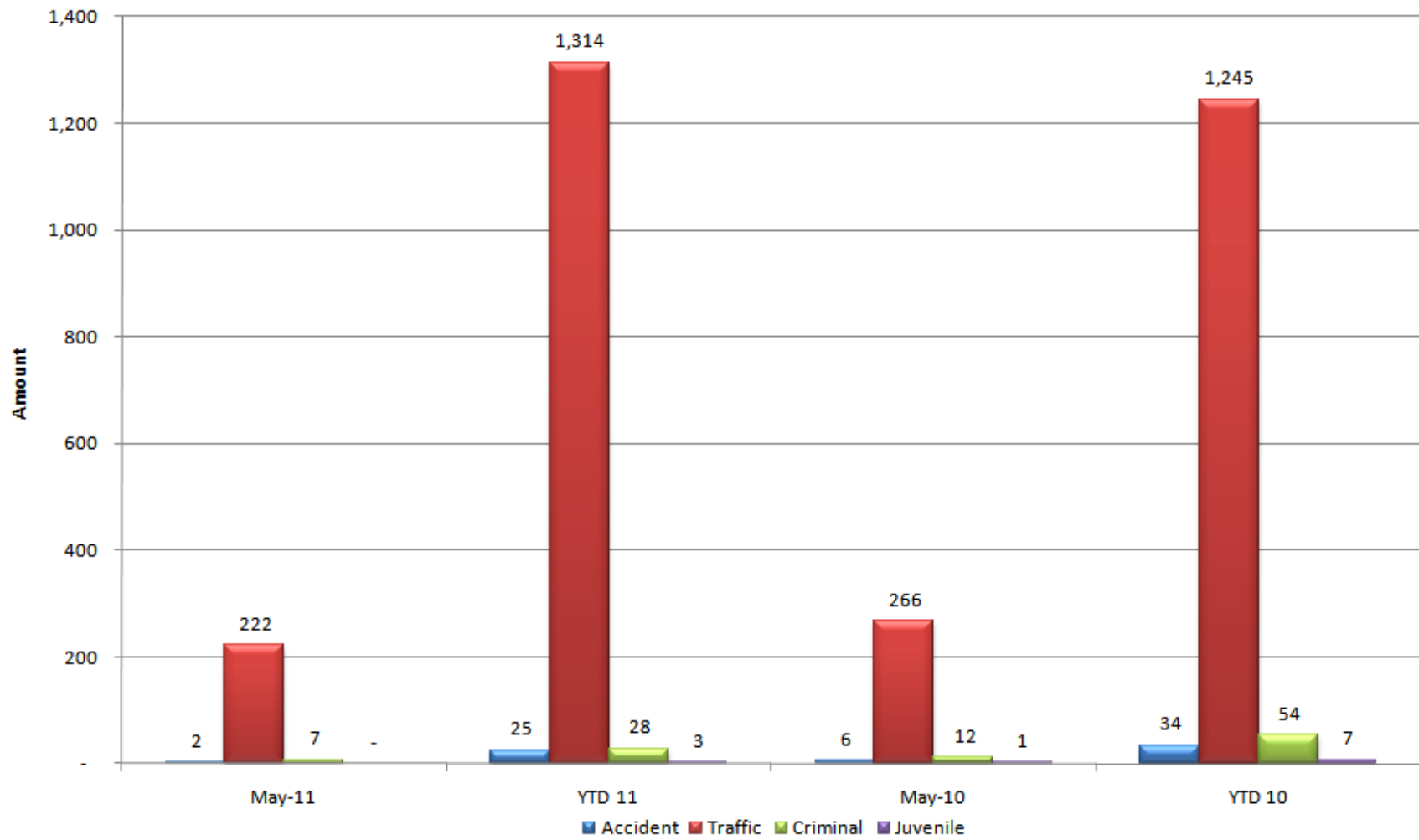
## Arrest Comparison
