Monthly Report

INTRODUCTION

The monthly report is intended to serve as an overview of the Ashland Police Department's effort to combat crime within the Town of Ashland. The report contains information about the number of criminal offenses during the month of November 2011 and the activities undertaken by the Police Department to improve the overall quality of life for the community.

The information helps the Police Department develop strategies for providing a safe environment in which to live, work, visit and play. The information is also intended to keep the public and officials informed.

For the month of November our officers made a total of 31 criminal arrests. The department handled 37 Group-A offenses, of which 19 thus far have been cleared which gives our department a monthly clearance rate of 51.4%. Our overall clearance rate for all crimes is 67.1%.

Activity Highlights

Day Shift (12 Hour)

- Responded to **476** calls for service.
- Made **15** criminal arrests with **21** criminal charges.
- Completed **365** park, walk and talk activities.
- Completed **56** police reports.
- Issued **162** summons, **4** parking tickets and **97** warnings.
- Completed **7** adopt-a-senior visits.
- Completed **23** lunch buddy visits.
- Completed **32** bank checks.

Midnight Shift (12 Hour)

- Responded to **311** calls for service.
- Made **15** criminal arrests with **21** criminal charges.
- Made **1** DUI arrest.
- Completed over **329** park, walk and talk activities.
- Completed **26** police reports.
- Issued **64** summons and **110** warnings.
- Completed **2327** property checks.
- Secured **6** open doors to businesses.
- Completed **3** adopt-a-senior visits.
- Had **827** community contacts.

Progress in the South Taylor, Arlington and Randolph Streets Corridor

Officers handled **19** calls for service in this area, completed **85** park, walk and talk activities as well as **60** hours of traffic enforcement, observation and bike patrol time. Officers made **1** criminal arrest, and made **128** community contacts.

Investigations

- **Ten** cases were assigned this month, **one** arrests was made, **four** cases were open inactive, and **four** were inactive.
- A sexual assault was committed involving a minor against another minor. As a result one felony warrant was obtained.
- Several other cases were handled through the month, but were found to be unfounded or prosecution of the cases was declined by the Commonwealth's Attorney's office.

Training

- The department conducted semi-annual firearms qualification training including night fire.
- The department conducted use of force in-service training.
- The department conducted CPR/AED re-certification training

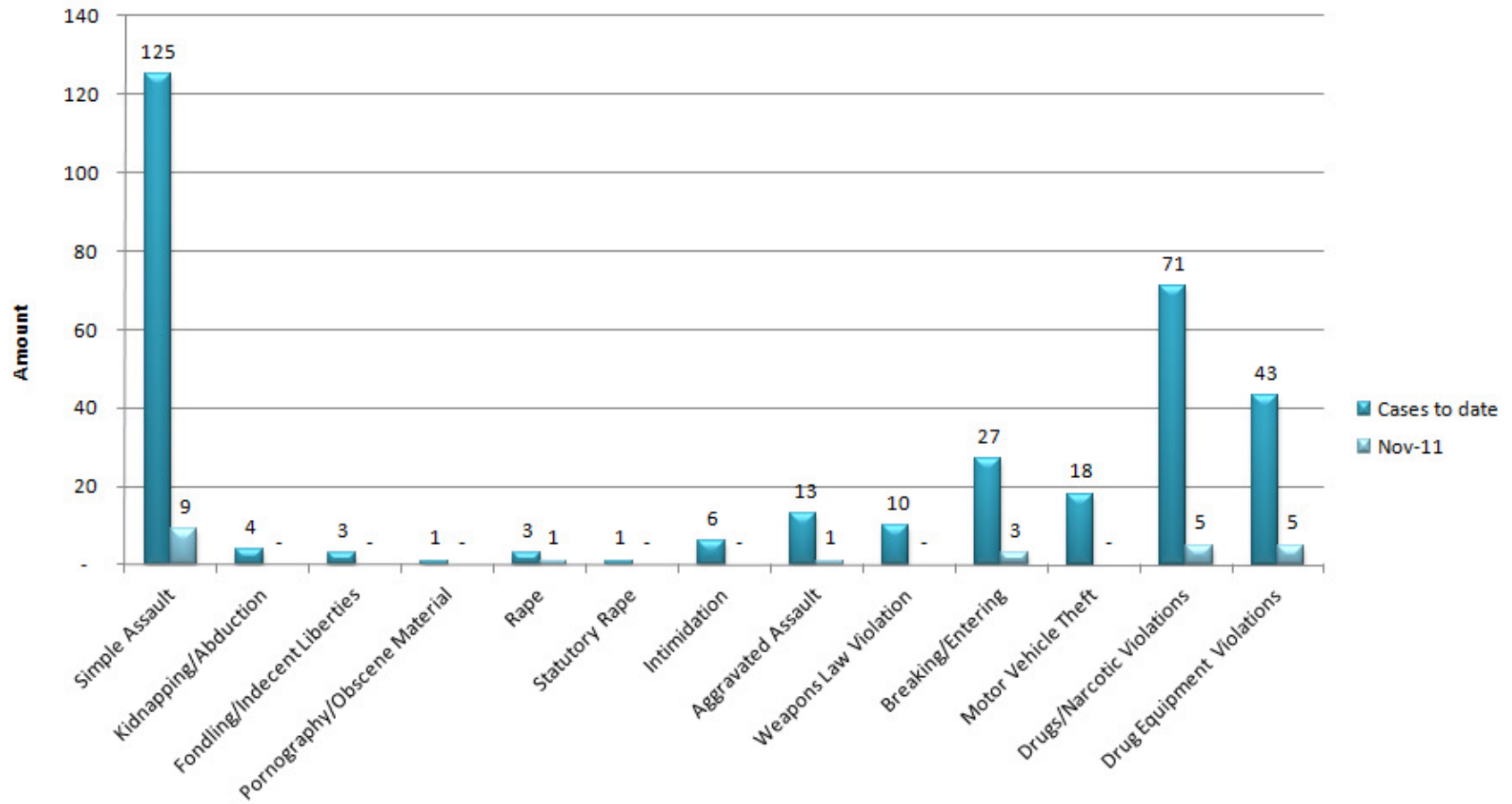
Community Policing

- Reviewed **6** CPTED plans.

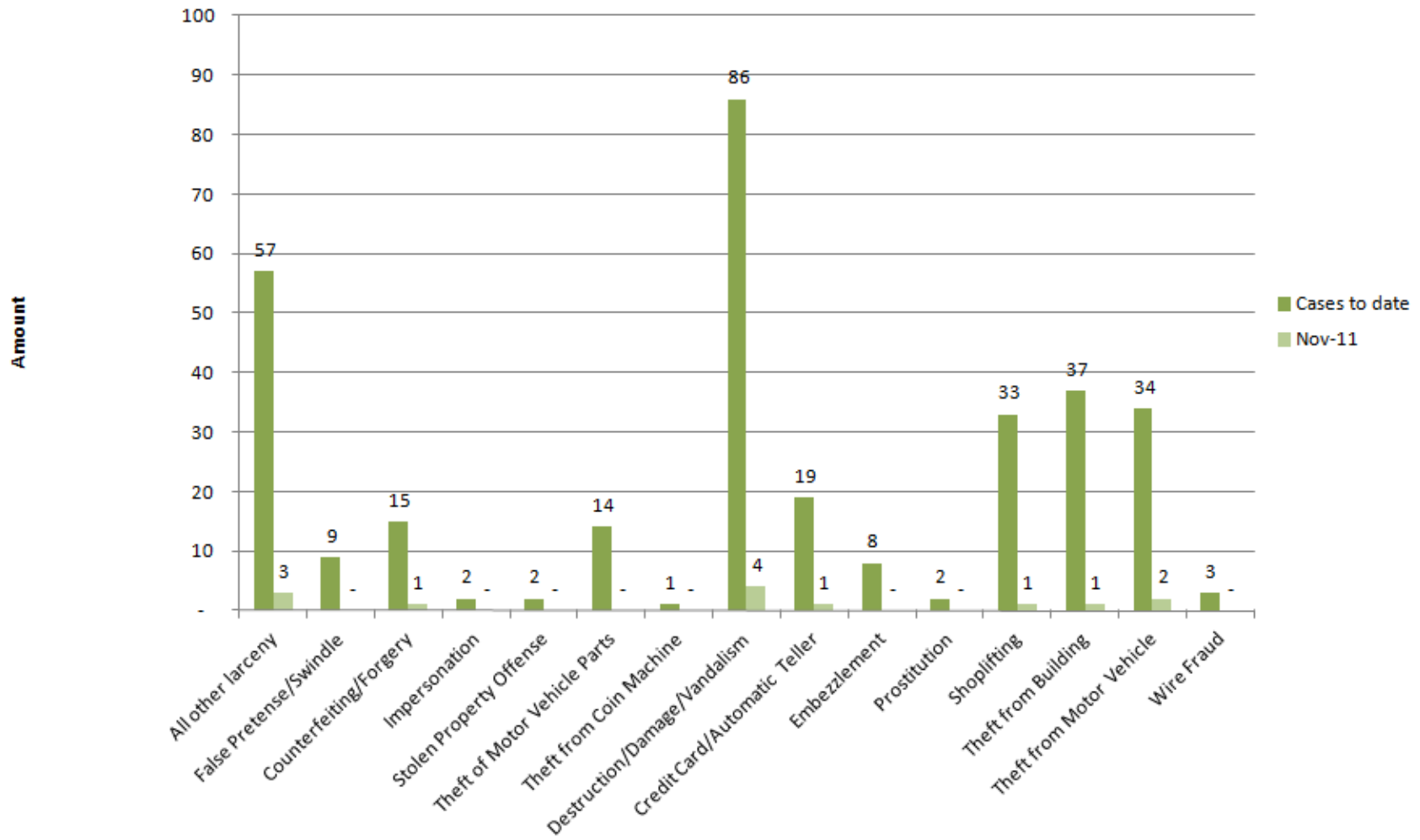
Highlights

- On November 1, 2011, an officer responded to the 1000 block of Maple Street for a report of vandalism. Three subjects were located in the area. Two subjects were arrested for vandalism and contributing to the delinquency of a minor. One subject was arrested for vandalism and for a curfew violation.
- On November 2, 2011 an officer responded to Wal-Mart for a possible prescription fraud. The officer spoke to the complainant and located the suspect. Through investigation he was able to gather probable cause to arrest the suspect for prescription fraud.
- On November 15, 2011 an officer stopped a vehicle for a traffic offense. The officer found the driver to have a suspended license 3rd offense. The driver was arrested for driving while suspended and transported to PRJ.
- On November 18, 2011 officers responded to the 7-11 located on Thompson Street for a larceny from the safe. Upon arrival and through investigation it as determined that an employee took the money from the safe. The employee was subsequently charged with embezzlement.
- November 18, 2011 officers assisted in the apprehension of wanted fugitive. Subject was wanted out of Ashland, Henrico, Richmond and Chesterfield. Ashland charges were for the distribution of cocaine.

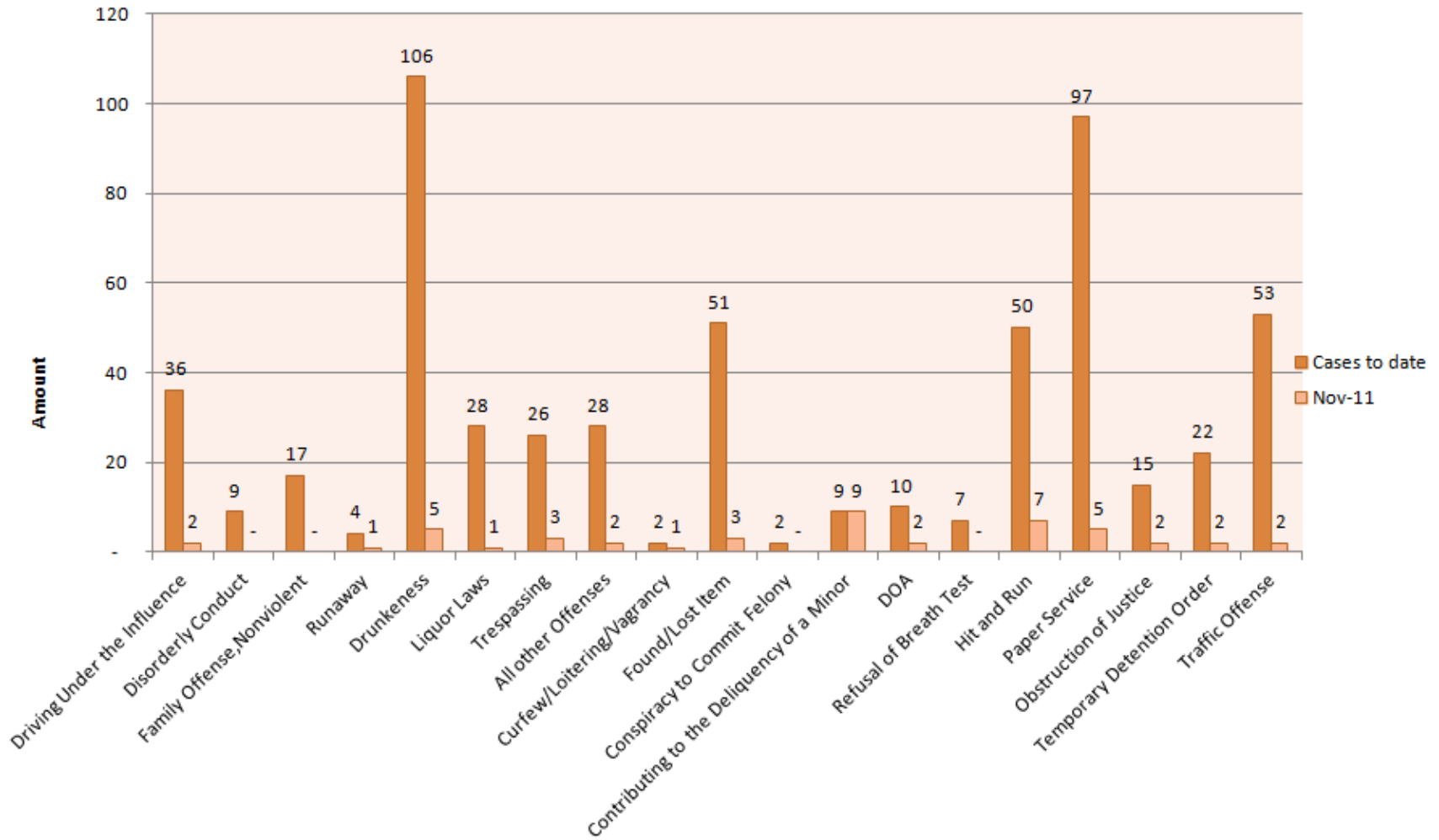
Group A Offenses - Violent



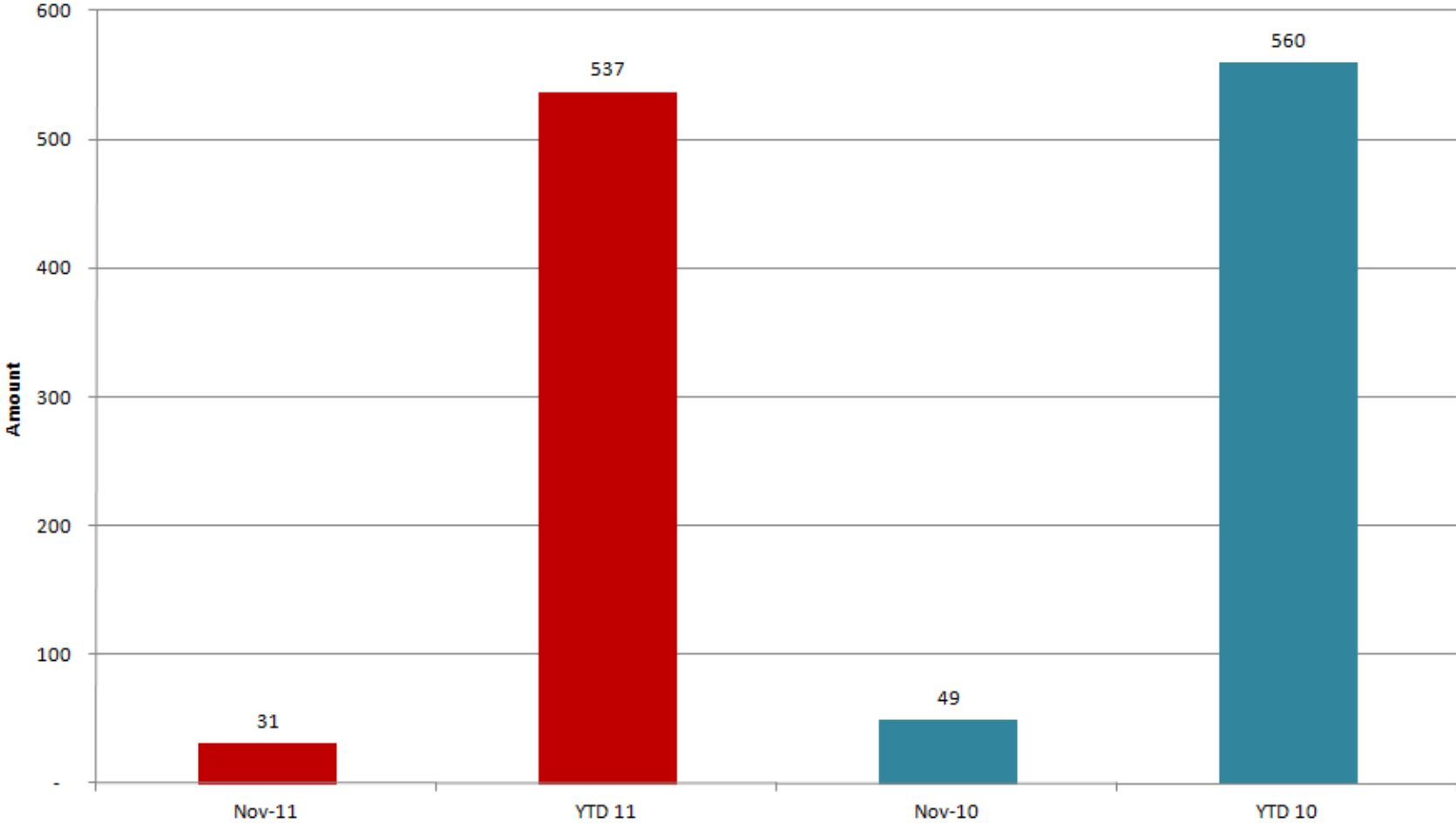
Group A Offenses - Non-Violent



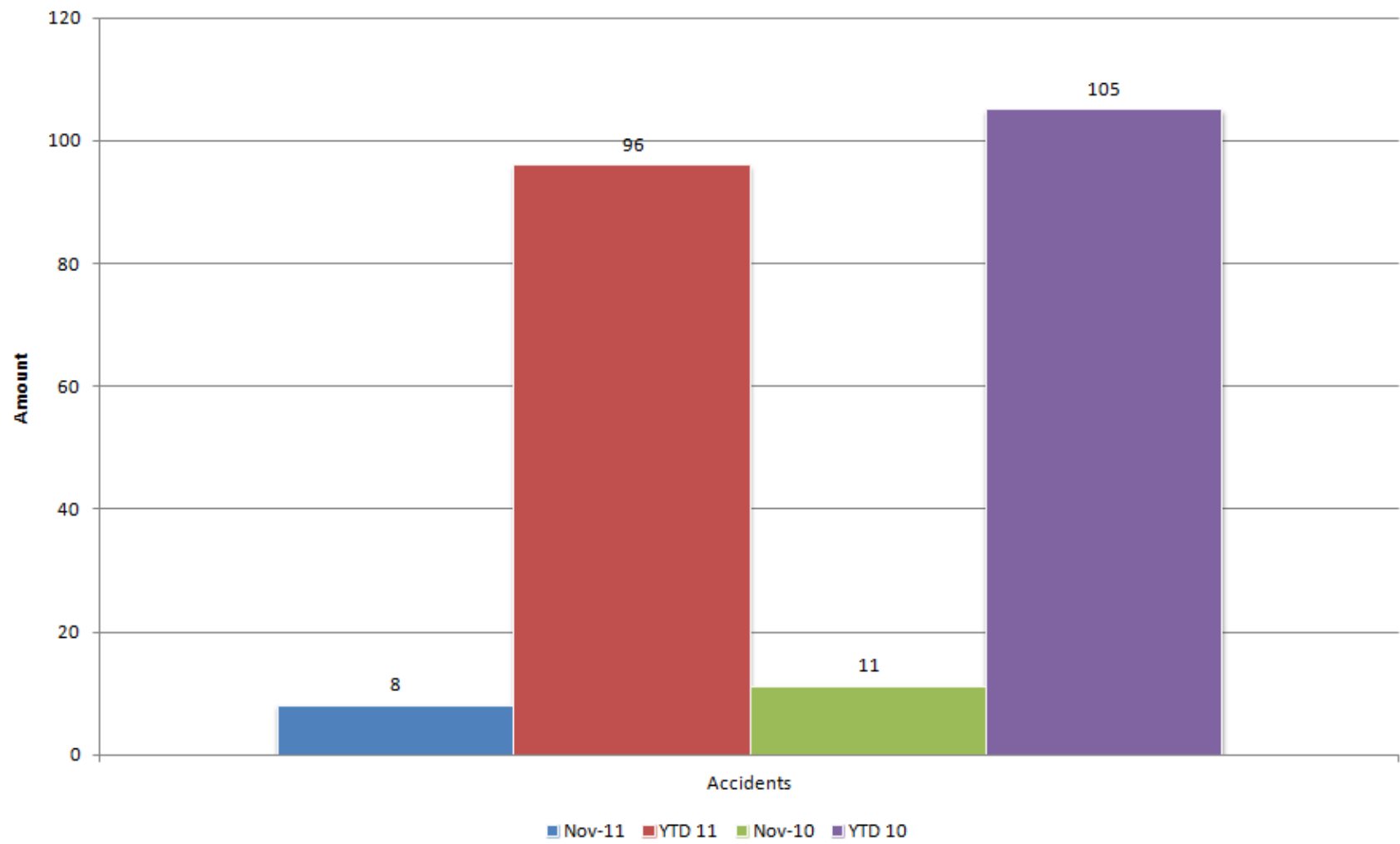
Group B Offenses



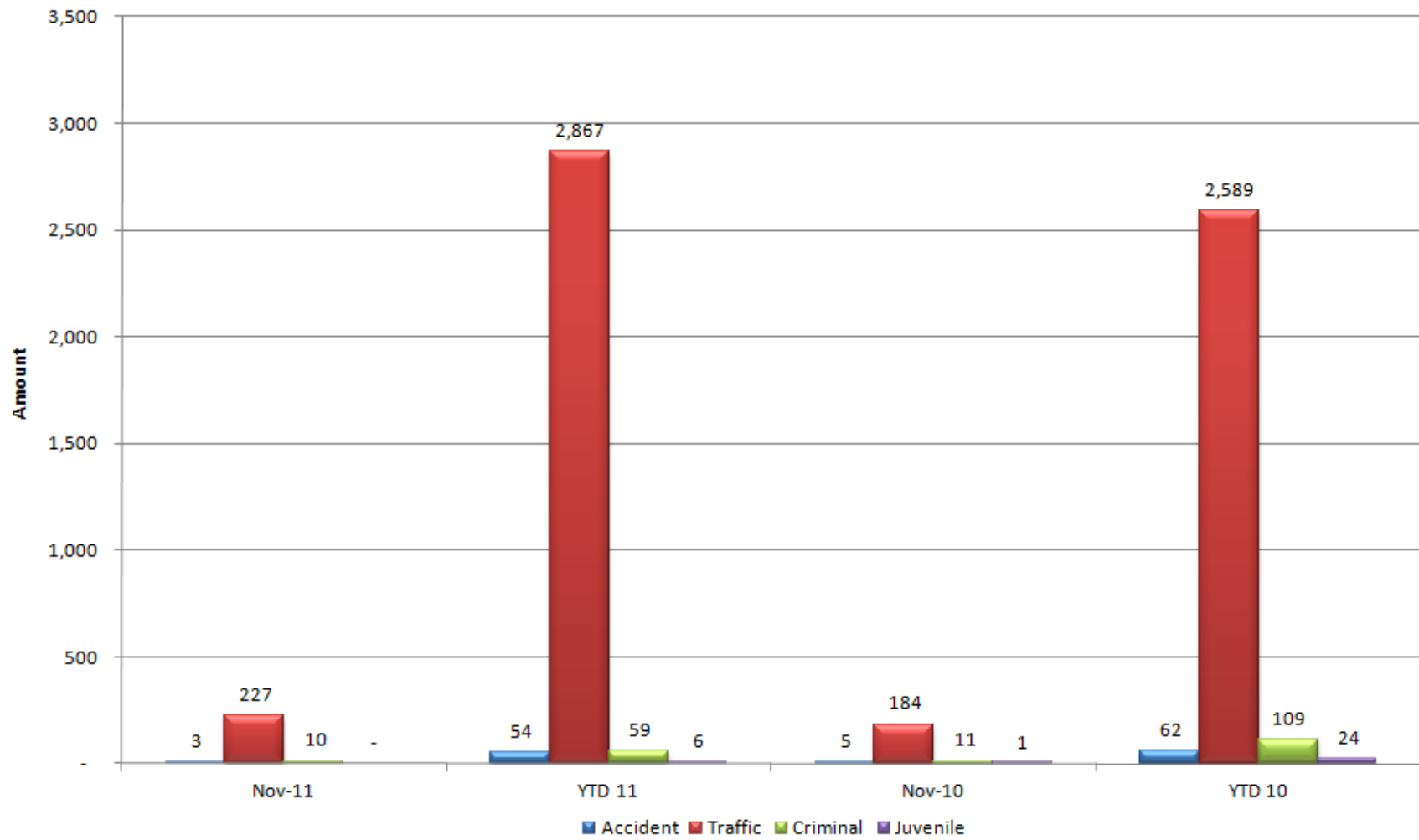
Arrest Comparison
